



## New 1000-krone banknote from Danmarks Nationalbank

The new 1000-krone banknote, with The Great Belt Bridge as its motif, will be issued on Tuesday, 24 May 2011.

The series has been designed by the artist Karin Birgitte Lund in collaboration with Danmarks Nationalbank's Banknote Printing Works.

Karin Birgitte Lund has chosen to interpret bridges as links between various parts of Denmark and the banknotes as links between the past and the present.

### Low numbers

The banknotes will have sequence number A0xxxx. The sequence number can be found in the lower right-hand corner. The serial number of each banknote is printed on the left-hand side just below the denomination.

The serial number consists of 6 digits followed by a letter. While several banknotes may have the same combination of digits, the end letter will vary, making the serial number unique. The serial numbers will indicate that the banknotes are from the first batch.

It will not be possible to order specific numbers. The banknotes are distributed as orders

are received. The banknotes are supplied in acid-free plastic pockets.

### Last edition of the old 1000-krone banknote

From 24 May 2011 it will also be possible to purchase banknotes from the last edition of the old 1000-krone banknote. These banknotes have sequence no. B306xx.

Both new and old 1000-krone banknotes will be sold at face value. To cover the administration involved, a handling fee of DKK 200 including VAT will be charged per 10 banknotes – in the same way as for sales of Faroese banknotes.

An order may include several banknotes from both series and from the Faroese series, but the handling fee will be charged for every 10 banknotes ordered.

On top of the handling fee come the postage costs for deliveries from the Royal Danish Mint.

### Purchase the new 1000-krone banknote

### Facts:

There are some 30 million 1000-krone banknotes in circulation compared to a total number of banknotes of 163 million.

The 1000-krone banknote comprises more than half of the total value of notes in circulation of just over kr. 56 billion.

In 2010 339 counterfeit 1000-krone banknotes were removed from circulation compared to a total number of 762 registered counterfeit banknotes.
